Says His Most Crucial Task Ahead Will Be His Publication Design Class

Objectives Clearly Outlined

This course is designed to provide familiarity with the theory and practice of creating electronic page layouts and the operation of design software.

Upon successful completion of the course, the student will be able to utilize publication design techniques in the creation of page layouts in conjunction with current imaging software techniques and standard industry practices.

Attendance Will Be Mandatory

Each assignment is designed to lay a foundation for the next, so attendance is mandatory. With excessive unexcused absences, a student may be dropped from the class or given a failing grade. Remote students should respond to my emails on the day of class to check in. Students may need to self-schedule extra time to develop skill and to complete assignments (recommend 6 extra hours of study per week).

Students To Be Evaluated

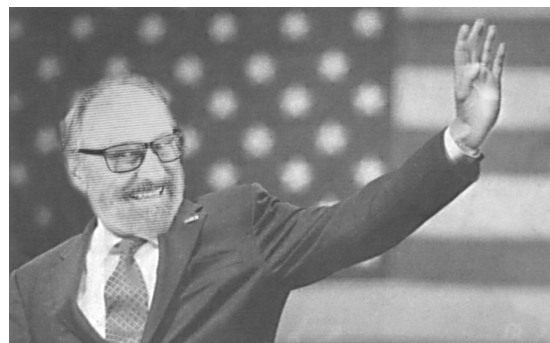
Students will be evaluated on their

This course helps students develop a theoretical base for the understanding of publication design, while featuring practical, hands-on use of the latest professional software for solving page layout and design problems. Using the latest Macintosh computers and software, with an emphasis on Adobe InDesign, students will develop a fundamental knowledge of the publication design industry by completing a series of assignments using current professional digital design techniques.

Portfolio presentation: The last week will be a wrap-up of any unfinished projects, or projects needing corrections, culminating in the presentation of a properly prepared digital portfolio.

Evaluation Clearly Explained

Each student is expected to attend every class. After three (3) unexcused absences a student may be dropped from the class or given a failing grade. Remote students should respond to my emails on the day of class to check in. In addition to attendance, students will be evaluated on their ability to produce assignments which demonstrate skillful and imaginative use of the medium, including ability to meet assignment due dates.

Each assignment will be given a letter grade applied as follows:

B- = 80-82 B = 83-86 B+ = 87-89

Change the decade to 90s, 70s and 60s for As, Cs and Ds, respectively. All assignment grades will be averaged at the end of the semester into one Assignments grade worth 1/3 of the final grade. Students will also be evaluated on participation and Classwork (1/3), and a Final Digital Portfolio (1/3). These criteria will each be assigned a letter grade as well. The three thirds will be averaged for the final grade. Montgomery College requires the assignment of a final "hard" letter grade, with no pluses or minuses. Therefore final scores of, for example, from 80 through 89 would all result in a grade of B.

Prerequisite Required for All Students

The prerequisite for this course is GDES116 or permission of the Instructor. This prereq will be strictly adhered to. Students without the prereq will be asked to withdraw from the class until they have completed it or obtained permission. In addition, and in order to ensure success in this Graphic Design class,

students should have some experience with drawing, design and color skills, a working knowledge of Photoshop and Illustrator, and also a good familiarity with the materials and techniques commonly used by the traditional graphic designer in a modern communications design studio.
